Based on Article 21(4) of the Plant Products Act (PPPs Act; UL RS 83/12) the Minister of Agriculture, Forestry and Food issues the following

Rules on points of entry and the conditions for introduction of plant protection products into the customs territory of the European Union and the procedures of control

Article 1 (Subject)

These Rules are laying down the points of entry and conditions for introduction of plant protection products (hereinafter: PPPs) into the customs territory of the European Union (hereinafter: EU) through the territory of the Republic of Slovenia and the detailed control procedures prior to introduction of PPPs into the customs territory of EU.

Article 2 (Consignment of PPPs)

A 'consignment of PPPs' means the quantity of PPPs, intended for introduction into the customs territory of EU and for which the same documents shall be inspected as for customs or other formalities.

Article 3 (Points of entry)

(1) Consignments of PPPs shall be introduced into the customs territory of EU through the points of entry as defined in Annex constituting an integral part of these Rules.

(2) Consignments of PPPs shall be released for free circulation into the territory of the Republic of Slovenia through the offices of the Financial Administration of the Republic of Slovenia which carry out tasks defined by customs regulations and where also the phytosanitary control is carried out.

Article 4 (Documentation and conditions)

Consignments of PPPs intended for introduction into the customs territory of EU shall be accompanied by documents including:

- 1 Name and address or firm and headquarter address of the distributor of the consignment of PPPs.
- 2 Name and address or firm and headquarter address of the consigner of the consignment of PPPs from the state of origin.
- 3 Name and address or firm and headquarter address of the consignee of the consignment of PPPs.
- 4 Name and address or firm and headquarter address of the manufacturer of the consignment of PPPs.
- 5 A means and the number of transportation.
- 6 A destined state.
- 7 Information on PPPs:
 - Trade or chemical names of PPPs,
 - Packaging and number of packages,
 - Volume of PPPs,

- If the destined state is an EU Member State: the evidence on authorisation of PPPs in that Member State: the number of permit/registration of PPPs, or authorisation/permit certificate of PPPs from that Member State, and safety data sheets.

Article 5
(Declaration of the consignment of PPPs)

When the consignment of PPPs intended for introduction into the customs territory of EU arrives to the point of entry as referred to in Article 3 of these rules, the distributor shall notify its arrival to the phytosanitary inspector who carries out the control at this point of entry. The notification shall be submitted in writing by submission of the documents from previous article.

Article 6
(Control)

(1) The control carried out by phytosanitary inspector comprehends the examination of documents. Phytosanitary inspector may by his or her own judgement also check the identity or sample the PPPs in the consignment.

(2) Phytosanitary inspector writes down on the submitted documents whether the introduction of the consignment of PPPs is allowed and the date and place of inspection signed and confirmed by the official stamp.

Article 7
(Transit to corresponding warehouse)

If the PPP consignment is intended to be released for free circulation into the customs territory of the Republic of Slovenia and if the phytosanitary inspector has found irregularities which may be rectified subsequently (e.g. if the consignment has not been accompanied with safety data sheets in accordance with regulations on chemicals; or with label in Slovenian language), the phytosanitary inspector may decide in consent with customs officers that the PPP consignment is transmitted to a bonded or corresponding warehouse in the interior of the state; where after the irregularities being rectified, the phytosanitary inspector carries out inspection before releasing of PPP consignment for free circulation into the territory of the Republic of Slovenia.

Article 8
(Repeal)

On the date of entry into force of these Rules, the Rules on defining the border posts for circulation of PPPs and the control procedures at their introduction (UL RS 89/2004 and 83/12) shall be repealed.

Article 9
(Entry into force)

These Rules shall enter into force on the fifteenth day following publication in the *Uradni list Republike Slovenije*.

Points of entry are:

- a) For international naval traffic: Koper - Port Koper.
- b) For international air traffic: Ljubljana - Aeroport Jožeta Pučnika.
- c) For international post: Ljubljana – General Post Office Ljubljana.
